April 13th Set for Election of LOOM Board of Officers

Five seats are up for grabs in April on the nine member Loyal Order Of Moose (LOOM) Board of Officers of the Mankato Moose Lodge #1414. Candidates are needed for the position of Lodge Governor, Junior Governor, Prelate, Treasurer and Trustee. All positions are for one year except for the three year term of Trustee. Contact David Cowan, Nominating Committee Chairman, or Lodge Administrator Lee Overmoen for Candidate Acceptance forms which describe the functions of each office. LOOM Lodge #1414 received the Moose Lodge of the Year Award for 2004 out of the 30 LOOM Lodges throughout Minnesota, and has consistently met its membership enrollment quotas. 2005-06 Officers for WOTM Chapter Elected March 16th

Women of the Moose (WOTM) Chapter #606 has a six member Board of Officers. A Chapter Nominating Committee has already reviewed candidate recommendations in preparation for an official vote to be held on Wednesday, March 16, 2005. Available seats on the Board include: a one year term for Senior Regent, Junior Regent, Chaplain, Secretary-Treasurer, and Recorder. Elections will be held Wednesday, March 16. The Minnesota Traveling Trophy for Best Membership Participation was earned this year by Chapter #606.

Joint Management Board Election Wed., April 13th

Mankato's "bold experiment" is nearing its first anniversary on May 1, 2005. One year ago, with the involvement of the members of both the Women of the Moose (WOTM) Chapter #606 and the men's Loyal Order of Moose (LOOM) Lodge #1414, a Joint Management Board (JMB) of seven people was formed to take over all the financial and decorum responsibilities of the Lodge's Social Quarters. (The seven seats came from: 3 at-large; 2 appointed by the LOOM Board of Officers; 2 from the WOTM Chapter Board.)

In setting about its new duties, the JMB: adopted a \$148,000 annual income and spending plan; put in place certain price and rate changes; signed off on a proposal to affiliate with the area dart league; acted on recommendations from a routine Moose International audit; served as the conduit for hosting a state-wide Mid-Year Conference of the Minnesota Moose Association and Academy of Friendship; created a new financial separation between LOOM activities and that of the Social Quarters; had special meetings with employees; conducted fixed asset and disposable supply inventories; oversaw new physical plant improvements including a wall mural, improved lighting, and new kitchen improvements; purchased a computer to accommodate financial software upgrades from Moose International; and dealt with decorum issues.

The terms of these three JMB members expire April 30th: Roger Hannum (at-large director); Rose Ann Sheldrup (WOTM Chapter representative), and Dennis Just (LOOM Board of Officers representative). Of the three seats, only one is available for election from the combined membership of WOTM and LOOM. The at-large director's seat is for three years and will expire 4/30/08. Prospective candidates for the job should contact Lee Overmoen. A JMB Election Committee consisting of the LOOM Governor, LOOM Administrator, WOTM Chapter Senior Regent, and WOTM Chapter Recorder of the Lodge, will prepare the JMB ballot.

Though held on the same day as the LOOM Board of Officers Election, the Joint Management Board's election ballot will be different and tabulated separately. Balloting runs from 3 PM to 8 PM on Wednesday, April 13, 2005, and will be held at the Mankato Moose Family Center. Remember to show your membership card when you vote.

Academy of Friendship Degrees Awarded

The Academy of Friendship is a Degree earned by a local "Co-Worker" serving as a Chapter Development Chairman or an officer. The local Chapter must also earn the Award of Achievement which requires that it have enrollments on at least eight Chapter nights and an increase of membership of at least five at the close of the year.

At its Feb 22 meeting the JMB reaffirmed its commitment to existing Moose International restrictions and agreed to purchase special guest stickers for visitors who sign in the Guest Book.

It’s no surprise members can get carded by a bartender or gambling booth worker. It’s a built-in protection to keeping our charter.

LOOM and WOTM members need to carry their Moose membership card at all times. Don’t get upset at a bartender who requests to see your membership card.

Now some of us have a card that has expired and we need to renew our membership ASAP. Easy to do. Just write a check and give it to the Lodge Administrator Lee Overmoen for Lodge #1414 or the appropriate WOTM officer for Chapter 606. (See the rates in the article above.)
